## Elizabeth Ministry

As our Elizabeth Ministry rosebud program continues, we are pleased to say we have had a wonderful response to this program. You will find silk rosebuds in a basket at the Sacred Heart Altar next to a vase with silk baby's breath flowers. The rosebuds represent a sacred life. A **pink** rosebud is to honor **pregnancy** and the unborn baby. A **red** rosebud celebrates **birth** or **adoption**. A **white** rosebud remembers a **child lost** through miscarriage, abortion, stillbirth, or death. A **yellow** rosebud represents those **waiting to conceive** or **adopt**.

Attached on each rosebud is a tag with a place to write information regarding pregnancy, birth, adoption, loss, or trying to conceive or adopt. People are invited to remove a rosebud from the basket, fill in the attached tag, and put the rose in the vase. Prayer cards for each situation are displayed next to the vase. Those filling out the tags are invited to take a prayer card for their own personal prayer. St. Mary's Cathedral parish members promise to pray for those represented by the rosebuds.

## Why Catholic?

### *Jesus and Mary Teach Us to Pray*

As a child, Jesus first learned to pray from Mary and Joseph. As He grew in age, He also joined in prayer at the synagogue and at the Temple. His Heavenly Father was also Jesus' source of prayer. This was evident at the age of twelve when Jesus went to the Temple and revealed: "I must be in my Father's House" (Luke 2:49). Jesus called His Father "Abba", Aramaic for "Daddy". Jesus learned to pray in his humanity. Mary passed on to Jesus many of the favorite prayers of her people. Though we have no formal record of what Joseph may have taught Jesus, we can be reasonably sure that he would have taught his foster Son, by word and example, the reverence, attitudes, and rituals that accompanied holy meals at home and behavior at the synagogue. 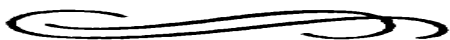
## **Special Nocturnal Adoration Anniversary Mass**

## FROM THE RECTOR'S DESK

The Roman Missal (the ritual text for the celebration of Mass) was first issued by Pope Paul VI in 1970 with a second edition published in 1975. In the Jubilee Year 2000, Pope John Paul II issued a revised version. Recently, the English translation of the revised Roman Missal has been completed. Among other things, the revised edition contains prayers for the observances of recently canonized saints, additional prefaces for the Eucharistic Prayers, additional Votive Masses, and some updated and revised instructions for the celebration of the Mass. This new English translation will also include updated translations of prayers we currently use at Mass, including some of the well-known responses and acclamations of the people.

A date has not yet been set when this new Roman Missal will be implemented in the parishes of the United States. In all likelihood, it will be several months away. However, over the next several weeks, you will find articles in our bulletin that will help to explain the why and what of the new changes. As I mentioned above, the changes will affect many of the prayers we have become accustomed to praying at Mass.

Today we rejoice and celebrate *World Day for Consecrated Life*. Over the years, many men and women have chosen to live out their baptismal vocation by professing the evangelical counsels of poverty, chastity, and obedience. They do this by joining a religious congregation, a secular institute, or through private vows. ## Food Sense

Food Sense is a program for the distribution of surplus food. It is operated through the Food Bank of Central New York and Feeding America. Each month features a standard package of food for \$15.50. Specials are available for an additional charge.

*How does it work?* Once a month food is delivered to the First Presbyterian Church in Ogdensburg. Orders are picked up on a Thursday afternoon between 12:00 and 1:30 PM. If a group orders together, one person can pick up all the food for that group. This month's pick-up will be February 25.

*Who can participate?* Food Sense is open to anyone, regardless of income. In fact, there is a minimum of 30 standard orders per month for the program to continue.

*How to order?* February orders can be placed at the Presbyterian Church on February 1-4 from 9 AM to 5 PM. Payment is due at the time of ordering. For more information, please call 393-2510.
