### Stations of the Cross

From the earliest times, pilgrims to Jerusalem have retraced our Lord's steps in His passion. At those points where special events in His journey to Calvary took place, they stopped to meditate. From this custom sprang the construction of imitations of the "Via Dolorosa" in Jerusalem which are to be found in most parish churches around the walls. Each "station" is marked by a wooden cross to which a picture is often added. There are fourteen stations.

### Reverend Cyril Rapin Pro-Life Scholarship

The Diocesan Respect Life Office, in conjunction with Champlain Valley Right to Life and the Bishops' Apostles for Life, is pleased to announce the second annual **Reverend Cyril Rapin Pro-Life Scholarship**. The 2010 stipend of \$500 will be awarded at the end of June. The application process is open to Catholic students of the Diocese of Ogdensburg who are high school seniors (equivalent home schooled students) and have been witness to the Gospel of Life by their pro-life activities in promoting and defending respect for the sanctity of human life. Completed applications must be received by **April 30**. The scholarship fund was made possible by a generous bequest of the late Father Cyril Rapin to Champlain Valley Right to Life, whose officer established the scholarship in his memory to honor his support of the pro-life cause and to encourage young people to carry on his commitment to the Gospel of Life. The funds are invested in the Diocesan Trust Fund, and the income generated by the principal amount will be used each year to fund the award. It is our hope that, over time, the fund will grow to allow more scholarship money to be available in the future.
