Divine Mercy Sunday

This Sunday, **April 11**, is Divine Mercy Sunday. We will be praying the Divine Mercy Chaplet at 2:00 PM in the main Cathedral. You are cordially invited to attend.

In 1931, Our Lord appeared to St. Faustina Kowalska, a Polish nun of the Congregation of the Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy. Based on this private revelation, St. Faustina presented the message of the Divine Mercy in the Diary of St. Faustina Kowalska.

Devotion to the Divine Mercy involves a total commitment to God as mercy. It is a decision to trust completely in Him, to accept mercy with thanksgiving, and to be merciful as He is merciful. Our Lord, to St. Faustina, directed that the First Sunday after Easter be dedicated to Divine Mercy and to the veneration of the image of Divine Mercy. Our Lord wishes to grant a complete pardon of sins and punishment to those who observe this Feast.

To fittingly observe this Feast, one should (1) celebrate the feast on this Sunday after Easter; (2) sincerely repent sins; (3) place complete trust in Jesus; (4) go to confession, preferably before that Sunday; (5) receive Holy Communion on the day of the Feast; (6) venerate the Image of the Divine Mercy; and (7) be merciful to others through actions, words, and prayers on their behalf.

Divine Mercy and Pro-Life

Pope John Paul II declared the Sunday after Easter to be Divine Mercy Sunday. Many of the faithful pray the Chaplet of Divine Mercy regularly. There is a link between this devotion and the pro-life movement. Father Seraphim Michalenko, MIC, who was a principal translator of St. Faustina's diary, and the postulator of her cause of canonization, writes the following: On at least three occasions, from 8:00-11:00 in the evening, she felt like her insides were being torn apart. She suffered so much that she thought she was going to die. The doctors couldn't figure out what was ailing her, and no medication was able to alleviate her suffering. Later, she was given to understand that she was undergoing those pains for mothers who were aborting their children. (Diary, 1276)

On another occasion, she had a vision of an angel coming with thunderbolts to destroy one of the most beautiful cities of her country. She felt powerless to do anything about it. (Diary, 474) What antidote did the Lord give her? The Chaplet of Divine Mercy. She explained that the city was to be chastised for its sins, primarily the sin of abortion. (*Wombs of Mercy*, Marian Helpers Bulletin, Summer 1995)
