The Church celebrates Christian Unity from January 18-25, 2009, throughout the world. The theme for this year is, "That they may become one in your hand." You are invited to spend time, this week, reflecting on St. Paul and his legacy upon the life of the Church. As the Body of Christ, St. Mary's Cathedral Parish is offering a week of reflecting on the life of St. Paul and his legacy upon the life of the Church. Sessions will run from January 19-23, 2009, in the Bishop Brzana Memorial Hall from 6:30-8:00 PM. Five themes will be reflected and discussed throughout the week: (1) *Paul's World and Time Period and Biography*; (2) *Conversion/To Be One With Christ: St. Paul on Baptism*; (3) *To Be Forgiven: St. Paul on Baptism and Reconciliation*; (4) *St. Paul on the Eucharist*; and (5) *St. Paul and the Resurrection*.
