Precautions

The Diocese has received some inquiries about precautions in church settings against influenza, including H1N1. After consultation with the Episcopal Council and examination of measures taken by Catholic dioceses in the United States and Canada, Rev. Terry R. LaValley, Diocesan Administrator, is directing all parishes of the diocese to adopt the following measures beginning immediately:

1. To suspend the shaking of hands during the sign of peace. It may be replaced by a moment of silent prayer or a simple nod of the head or a wave of the hand to one's neighbor.
2. The reception of the Precious Blood from the Communion Cups/Chalice by the lay faithful is suspended in all parishes, at the present time. However, communicants who suffer from Celiac disease should be encouraged to approach their pastors to make arrangements for Holy Communion under the form of the Precious Blood.
3. It is recommended that parishioners receive Communion in the hand. Communion on the tongue does present hygienic problems during the flu season. Please note the proper way of receiving Communion in the hand is to approach the minister of Communion, bow, which may be done as the person in front of you is receiving Communion, place one hand out over the other.
4. Ministers of Communion are to make use of hand sanitizers before and after distributing Communion.

Why Catholic? Life in Christ-Walking with God

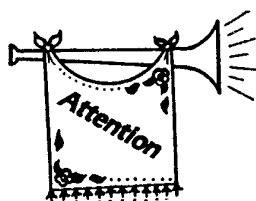
In the story of Zacchaeus (Luke 19:1-10), Zacchaeus came to understand that he needed to be in right relationship with the poor and thus His God when he gives half of his possessions to the poor. The seventh commandment, "**You shall not steal**," forbids unjustly taking or keeping the goods of one's neighbor. It also forbids wronging our neighbor in any way with respect to his or her goods. Justice and charity demand that we take care of the earthly goods and the fruits of people's labor (CC #2401). This is the call to responsible stewardship to all of God's creation and the fruits of the earth. The central interest of the Church's social teaching is justice for all, but especially for the helpless and the poor.
