Why Catholic? Life in Christ: Walking with God

"Love is the fundamental and innate vocation of every human being" (FC 11). God has created man and woman bestowing upon each one equally their personal dignity. "Christ is the model of chastity. Every baptized person is called to lead a chaste life, each according to his or her particular state of life" (CCC #2394). The gift of the fourth, sixth, and ninth commandments respectively: "**You shall honor your father and mother,**" **You shall not commit adultery,**" and "**You shall not covet your neighbor's wife,**" illustrate the principal ways in which God's plan for marriage and family is to be lived. The call to fidelity through the married couple's unitive love calls for complete self-surrender that is strengthened in the Sacrament of Matrimony. In today's culture, with the breakdown of family life, inappropriate sexual behavior, and domestic violence, there needs to be an understanding of the Church's teachings in the areas of living a sexually moral Christian life. This is a challenge for everybody.
