For your comfort, please bring a folding chair. If it is raining at this time, Mass will be celebrated at 9:15 AM in the Chapel.

Each year, we remind you of the importance of following the Rules and Regulations for our parish cemetery. We ask for your full cooperation in following these rules. Fences, lawn ornaments, statues on the ground, glass, artificial flowers, plastic, etc., **are not allowed**. These items will be removed if placed in the cemetery. If you are in need of a copy of the rules, please call the rectory office. We will be happy to mail a copy to you. These Rules and Regulations are also available at the cemetery.

Ground conditions this early in the spring are sometimes unstable, especially where we have had recent burials. We remind you to please be careful as you walk through the cemetery grounds. With the cooperation of all, we will be able to make our cemetery truly a beautiful memorial for our beloved deceased. Due to weather conditions, there are still a numbers of spring burials to take place. Top soil and finishing of grave sites will take place after burials are completed and conditions allow. Spor†scamp 2011 at Wadhams Hall

Sportscamp is a great place where boys and girls, ages 11-15, blend quality basketball and soccer training with personal and spiritual growth. The camp is operated in two five-day sessions. **Basketball Camp** is **July 3-7** and **Soccer Camp** is **July 10-14**. There is a significant amount of time for learning and playing under the direction of experienced coaches. Troubled Hearts

There are many people in our Church who come to the family of faith with troubled hearts - hearts that are broken, hurt, confused, or angry. The disciples' hearts were troubled because they did not understand where Jesus was going! Parents' hearts are discouraged because of their children's unknown future spiritually and economically. The Church's heart is concerned that there are not enough priests for the future of the Church's life of worship and sacraments. These are legitimate concerns, but Jesus tells us again in today's Gospel (John 14:1-12): "Do not let your hearts be troubled. You have faith in God; have faith also in me." He says further on: "I am the way, the truth, and the life." All is in God's hands. As a family of faith, we must have hope. He cares for us individually and as a community of believers. He understands that this is a difficult message, but He asks us to reflect deeply on His own words and actions - One who came to do His Father's will. Who is troubled and needs the comforting words of the Risen Lord? Reach out! Trust in the power of the Holy Spirit that you will be able to give comfort and guidance.
