Jesus, the Living Bread

"Taste and see the goodness of the Lord," says the psalmist. Jesus tells us in today's Gospel that He is the Living Bread. To eat the Bread of Life is to become what we eat - the living presence of Jesus among our brothers and sisters. How do we treat our brothers and sisters in Christ? St. Paul proclaims in the second reading from Ephesians to "be kind to one another, compassionate, forgiving one another as God has forgiven you in Christ." When we reach out to others in this manner and serve one another as Christ Jesus tells us to do, then those we serve are the living bread for us, feeding us in ways we could never imagine. The Spirit of God has a way of empowering us to taste and see His goodness beyond our expectations. To whom can we be the Living Bread for others? Who are those who feed us as the Living Bread of Christ? Reach out to someone in our parish, community, or family who seems to have been left out or visit someone that you have not seen in a while.

Sanctuary of Life

From within the heart of the world, the family has a decisive and determinative relationship with life. As a Sanctuary of life, the family must welcome it, defend it, accompany it during its development, especially during the whole process of its education...The family lovingly bears witness to the uniqueness of new life...The instruction of the Didache, "Thou shalt not kill the child in its mother's womb" (2,1), incorporated into the living tradition of the Church, must resound even today from the heart of every household.
