Take Up Your Cross - Follow Me

It seems that both Jeremiah and Peter have been "duped" by their God. Neither of them could understand that the ways and thoughts of God were not their own. God has a plan and it entails "taking up the cross" and "following Jesus" in the same manner as He did. Jesus became a sacrifice of love for each of us by His suffering, death, and resurrection. St. Paul came to understand this when he told the Romans "to offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God, your spiritual worship. In the celebration of the Eucharist, we remember again that Jesus became an acceptable sacrifice to the Father. We too offer ourselves with Jesus Christ so that we can become an acceptable sacrifice to the Father. St. Paul says, "Do not conform yourselves to this age but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and pleasing and perfect" (Romans 12:2).

This is being counter - cultural in this age. Understanding what it means for you and me to take up the cross and follow Jesus takes prayer, self-sacrifice, and a deep trust that God has not duped us. As we thirst and long for the living God; He longs and thirsts far more for us! What does taking up the cross mean for you? Has this meant suffering/ and or joy for you? How can the Church help people hear God's voice in their own
