### **A Family of Faith - A Community of Compassion**

To be an imitator of Christ, we must do what He did, show compassion for all people. Jesus' desire to heal was not to show His power but to show us the way of compassion "the passion to be with" someone in need. Jesus did not reject anyone who came to Him. It was the desire of the leper, (an outcast to the community), to be healed and he looked to Jesus with his plea of prayer, "if you *wish*, you can make me clean" (Mark 1:40). As a family of faith, we are called to the same kind of compassion to those whom we think are unclean. Who are they? The mentally ill? The addicts? The prostitutes? The sex abusers? How do we live out this way of healing in our Christian community? Do you provide a welcome to those excluded elsewhere? St. Paul reminds us that whatever we do, must do so that the glory of God might shine forth from us, the Church: A Family of Faith. How do your actions show the glory of God?

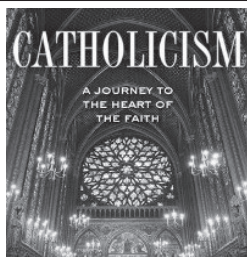
