Abortion Survivors

Child psychiatrist, Philip Ney, relates, "A woman reported telling her nine year old son about her abortion, which had taken place years before he was born. He said, "I knew, Mom, that there was something wrong. I always have nightmares about knives and my mother killing me. I have an imaginary brother who wants to kill me. If you had not aborted the other, would you have aborted me?" This is a story repeated more times than most people realize, and representing a societal and pastoral problem whose proportions are greater today than at any previous time in history: the phenomenon of tens of millions of abortion survivors. It is clear that abortion's primary victim is the child who is killed. It has also become increasingly clear that to kill the child is to harm the mother and father as well. What is not always so well known, however, is that abortion makes its impact felt on those who have had a sibling aborted. This impact is felt in surprising and astonishing ways that also have wider implications for the whole of society.
