Many of these families have limited resources with which to recover from this disaster. Your help is greatly needed! Please give generously to this special collection.

Elizabeth Ministry Rosebud program

Every member of St. Mary's Cathedral parish can participate in Elizabeth Ministry through the Rosebud Program. The Rosebud Program is a visual reminder of the precious blessing of each new life.

You will find silk rosebuds in a basket at the **Sacred Heart Altar** next to a vase with silk baby's breath flowers. The rosebuds represent a sacred life. A **pink** rosebud is to honor **pregnancy** and the unborn baby. A **red** rosebud celebrates **birth** or **adoption**. A **white** rosebud remembers a **child lost** through miscarriage, abortion, stillbirth, or child death. A **yellow** rosebud represents those **waiting to conceive** or **adopt**. Each rosebud has a tag attached with a ribbon. The tag has a place to write information regarding pregnancy, birth, adoption, loss, trying to conceive or adopt. People are invited to remove a rosebud from the basket, fill in the attached tag and **place the rosebud in the vase**. Please do not take the rosebud. Prayer cards for the various situations are displayed next to the vase. Those filling out the tags are invited to take a prayer card for their personal meditation. St. Mary's Cathedral parish members promise to pray for those the rosebuds represent.

Our Life in the Eucharist

Employment opportunity

Applications are invited for the position of **Pastoral Associate** with St. Mary's Parish in Canton, New York. This is a senior leadership position in the Parish, responsible for coordinating and developing lay leadership, supporting liturgical celebrations, and fostering pastoral outreach to the homebound and through parish evangelization. The Pastoral Associate is a member both of the Parish Pastoral Council and the Parish Finance Council. The anticipated starting date is August 1. Compensation will be in keeping with qualifications and experience, as well as Diocesan guidelines.
