Spor†scamp 2011 at Wadhams Hall

Sportscamp is a great place where boys and girls, ages 11-15, blend quality basketball and soccer training with personal and spiritual growth. The camp is operated in two five-day sessions. **Basketball Camp** is **July 3-7** and **Soccer Camp** is **July 10-14**. There is a significant amount of time for learning and playing under the direction of experienced coaches. There is also time for prayer, liturgy, and for reflection on some life skills that can be gained through sports. The bulk of the daily program will include multiple sessions of technical drills, tactical exercises, and skills stations. The dual focus of *Sportscamp*, quality sports training and faith development, is designed to help young people become both better athletes and people.

Each week is limited to 70 campers. Registrations are accepted on a first-come, first-serve basis and must include a non-refundable deposit of \$100.00. The camp fee is \$270.00 per camper. Did you know...

Beginning with the First Sunday of Advent (November 25, 2011), all the countries of the "English speaking world" will begin the use of a revised translation of the Order of Mass and the Prayers of the Mass.

You might ask, "Why a revised Missal?" The Church is the living "Body of Christ" and, as we journey through time, we grow in grace and experience. The current 2nd Edition of the Roman Missal in English (The Sacramentary) was published in 1985 and, in the past 26 years, many Masses (such as the inclusion of new saints) have been added to the Roman Calendar and to the Prayers of the Mass. It has led to this moment where the book itself needs to be both reprinted and "upgraded!"
