### Priesthood Sunday

"May our Lord Jesus Christ Himself and God our Father, who has loved us and given us everlasting encouragement and good hope through His grace, encourage your hearts and strengthen them in every good deed and word" (2 Thessalonians 2:16).



The virtue of hope anchors the Church, the family of faith, to the person of Jesus Christ. Today, we celebrate Priesthood Sunday recognizing that our priests teach and preach the Word of God and celebrate the sacraments, especially the Eucharist, to anchor us in being the Body of Christ. Let us pray for our priests to continue their ministry of love and service bringing the message of the Gospel to fulfillment.

**Priesthood Sunday** will be celebrated this **Sunday, November 7**, at 6:00 PM at the Knights of Columbus on Hasbrouck Street. Please plan to join us as we show our appreciation to all of our local priests who bring the love of Christ to us on a daily basis. ### Why Catholic?

*“But when you pray, go to your inner room, close the door, and pray to your Father in secret. And your Father who sees in secret will repay you” (Matthew 6:6). “Prayer is the work of the heart, not the lips, because God does not look at the words, but at the heart of him who prays.”*  
(Abbot Smaragdus-9th century)

To pray the *Our Father* is to pray with humility, acknowledging that no one knows the Son except the Father, and no one knows the Father except the Son. God, our Father, transcends the categories of the created world. To pray to the Father is to enter into His mystery as He is and as the Son has revealed Him to us (CCC #2779-Mt. 11:27). The *Our Father* has a key place in the prayer life of Christians, because it is a prayer taught by Jesus. This prayer lays the foundation for all our desires in the Christian life. It is truly the summary of the whole Gospel. The first three petitions praise and glorify God. How do we make God's name more holy, bring about God's kingdom on earth, and do God's will? What can you do to bring greater peace, justice, and harmony in your family, community, and world.

### Honoring Veterans

The 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month in 1918 saw the beginning of an armistice that brought a pause to the hostilities of the First World War. More than nine million soldiers were killed, over 21 million wounded, and five million more civilians died from disease or starvation. For those who signed the armistice, it was hoped that it would be the “war to end all wars.”

That was not the case. In 1938, on the eve of World War II, Congress passed a bill dedicating each November 11 “to the cause of world peace” under the title of Armistice Day. In 1954, that name was changed to Veterans' Day to honor all service men and women, including ceremonies at Arlington National Cemetery and parades in many cities.

**As we celebrate Veterans' Day this week, we pray in a special way for all who are currently serving in the armed forces, as well as all who have served in the past. May God bless you abundantly!**
