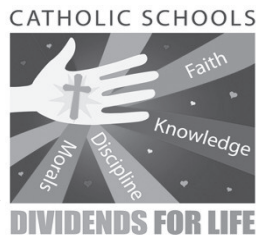

A Family of Faith—God's Vineyard *(The Lord Be With You)*

The readings from Isaiah and Matthew speak about God's vineyard. It is a story relationship of God's covenant with His people and our response to the covenant. God's vineyard is a garden where the seed of love grows and this love is meant to bear fruit. In Isaiah's account, the story is about God's people and how the people do not respond to the master's care and concern. In Matthew's Gospel, it is the story about the tenants who take over the vineyard and misuse it while the owner is away. The story is about unfaithfulness of the people and the tenants (the religious leaders) by contrasting it with the loving care of God and God's rightful expectation of an appropriate yield. We are the Church: A Family of Faith, One Family of Love that is in collaboration with God and with one another. We are called to grow, to bear fruit and to be transformed. As a worshipping community, we respond by recognizing that the Spirit of the Lord is with us and within us to help us to bear fruit. When we respond, "And with your spirit", we acknowledge the mutual presence of the Holy Spirit in the assembly and the priest since we all received the Holy Spirit at the time of our Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist. This gift of the Spirit guides us to be alert to God's signs in our lives. The vineyard and the workers have experienced many effects of God in their lives but they ignored them, explained them away, or turned them to their own ends. How alert are you to what God is saying to you? How has God cared for you in His vineyard? As a Family of Faith, how can you invite your friends who have been away from the Church back into the vineyard? Invite a friend to come to the **morning of Reflection and Prayer at Wadhams Hall on Saturday, October 8 from 9:30 am-12:00pm** to prepare for the *Third Edition of the Roman Missal*.
