### **A Family of Faith - Humility and Truth (Until You Come Again)**

As a family of faith, we are called to serve one another in humility and in truth. That is what Jesus commanded His disciples to be - a witness of love through service. Both Malachi's and Jesus' messages were strong. As a community of believers, they were to reflect and communicate God's love to one another with compassion, justice, and mercy, not just speak it. This was also Paul's message to the Thessalonians because they thought Jesus would soon be coming again. But Jesus' Second Coming had not come in the Thessalonians time and so Paul exhorted them to continue to be models of living their faith to other believers, not only in the Roman provinces, but to the whole world. In the Memorial Acclamation of the Mass, in proclaiming the mystery of our faith, we proclaim the core of our faith. It is who we are as Christians when "we proclaim" together what Jesus has done for us. "We proclaim" what we will do for one another, to live what we eat and drink as servants to one another, integrating faith and life as disciples of Jesus, "until You come again". This is the formula for achieving greatness in the reign of God. We do not know when Jesus will return, but He will return in all His glory and power. How can you be a better servant - leader to the wider community? Be a messenger of hope to someone whose faith is weak.

**Harvest Mass of Thanksgiving**

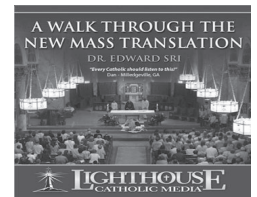
