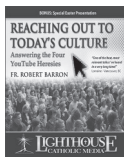

"The feast is ready..." The image of God's kingdom as a wedding feast expressed so beautifully from the readings of Isaiah and Matthew gives us hope. It is the hope of gathering of all peoples at the great feast on the Lord's mountain. Isaiah wants his readers to be aware that God's providence is not limited to the Israelites.
